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VICAR'S MESSAGE

PROMOTING ENDOGAMOUS MARRIAGES IN THE KNANAYA CATHOLIC COMMUNITY

Dear Parishioners,

We are filled with gratitude and joy as we witness the increasing number of endogamous marriages within the Knanaya Catholic youth in the United States. This positive trend is a testament to the vibrant community life and spiritual environment fostered in our Knanaya Catholic parishes and missions across the USA. The high volume of wedding banns announced in our churches and increasing number of attendances in the pre-marriage courses offered by Knanaya Catholic Region in the USA reflect this growing commitment among our youth to cherish and preserve our community's unique heritage.

Faith-Based and Cultural Foundations of Endogamy

Endogamy is not merely a cultural practice but has profound biblical and Jewish roots. In the Old Testament, we see patriarchs like Abraham and Isaac ensuring that their children married within their own community to preserve their faith and traditions (Genesis 24:3–4; Genesis 28:1). Similarly, the Jewish people upheld endogamous practices as a way to maintain their covenantal identity as God's chosen people. These examples highlight how marrying within one's community can serve as a means of safeguarding faith and heritage.

The Knanaya community's history is deeply intertwined with these traditions. Our roots trace back to the migration of Jewish Christians from the Chaldean Church in 345 AD. This community, led by Thomas of Kinai and Bishop Urha Mar Joseph, carried a legacy of faith, tradition, and endogamy as a means of preserving their faith, identity, values, and unity.

Preserving Our Rich Traditions and Faith

Endogamous marriages have helped maintain the continuity of the Knanaya community's rich traditions and Catholic faith. Our parishes in the USA provide an environment where our youth can interact with one another in faith-filled settings, similar to how previous generations grew up in Kerala. This has fostered not only loving connections but also spiritual and cultural formation among our young people.

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VICAR'S MESSAGE

The unique family bond and mutual support within our community are blessings we cherish. These qualities are deeply rooted in our practice of endogamy, which strengthens our sense of belonging and solidarity. The Catholic Church respects and supports the right of community members to marry among themselves, recognizing the role this plays in preserving cultural and spiritual identity.

A Call for Sensitivity and Mutual Respect

While upholding the endogamous nature of our community, it is vital to remember that this tradition must never be a cause of hurt for others. The love and respect we show to non-Knanaya Christians are equally important in embodying the universal call to love and unity that Christ has given us.

The recognition of the Knanaya community's identity by the Catholic Church, through the establishment of separate eparchy in Kerala and Knanaya regions outside India, is a testament to the importance of our traditions. Let us honor this recognition by fostering a respectful spirit that reflects our Christian values.

Moving Forward in Faith and Unity

Let us continue to uphold the beauty of our endogamous practices with a healthy and reasonable approach. By living out our faith and traditions authentically, we can inspire others to respect and love the Knanaya community. May our commitment to endogamy always be rooted in a desire to glorify God, preserve our heritage, and build strong families and communities.




