

VICAR'S MESSAGE

CELEBRATING THANKSGIVING IN FAITH AND FAMILY

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving, let us pause to recognize the profound spiritual meaning of this cherished American tradition. Though it is a national holiday, its spirit flows naturally into our Christian faith — a faith rooted in gratitude, humility, and the conviction that every blessing comes from the loving hands of God.

1. A Brief History of Thanksgiving in the United States

The first Thanksgiving traces back to 1621, when the Pilgrims, English Christians seeking religious freedom, gathered in Plymouth after surviving their first harsh winter in the New World. Assisted by the Wampanoag people, they learned to cultivate the land and experienced a bountiful harvest. Governor William Bradford declared days of thanksgiving, blending prayer, shared meals, and expressions of gratitude to God.

When we acknowledge God's generosity, we naturally become generous to others, especially the poor, lonely, and suffering.


